
History of original corner establishment:

Original 1/4 Corner set by Rufus S. Moore, under Contract No. 451, dated June 12, 1882.

Surveyor General Record states:

Set basalt stone $15 \times 8 \times 6$ for 1/4 Corner, Marked 1/4 on west face from which:

A Pine 15" Diameter Bears South, 55 LKS A Pine 4" Diameter Bears N28E, 17 LKS



Description of corner evidence found:

Found 18" # Pine dead - down - badly rotted - blaze evident, faint scribes visable.

Found stone 13 x 9 x 6 marked 1/4, loose; in Dry Creek bottom 7^{\pm} ft. downstream from corner position as established from record bearing and distance from BT.

No evidence of other BT found.

(See map of Survey, dated July, 1979.)
Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

At record bearing and distance from BT I set $2^12^1 \times 30^{11}$ iron pipe with brass cap marked as shown, 20^{11} in ground, from which:

A 12" Fir Bears S. 46 W., 45.7 ft. marked 1/4 S24 BT.

A 22" Fir Bears N. 38 W., 62.6 ft. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S13 BT.

Buried stone alongside pipe.

Raised mound of stone.
