
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment: Corner established in 1882 by Rufus S. Moore under General Land office contract no. 451. Surveyor General Record States;

Set basalt stone $18^{n} \times 13^{n} \times 12^{n}$ for $\frac{1}{4}$ corner marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face;

From which

A pine 16" in diameter bears N 53 E, 233 1ks.



No record of remonumentation found in county records.

Description of corner evidence found:

Stone of called size marked $\frac{1}{4}$

Found NE BT. stump, lower part of blaze visible at called distance and bearing.


Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner I set a $2\frac{1}{12}$ " x30" galvanized iron pipe with brass cap 20" in the ground and raised a mound of stone, at the location where the stone lay, from which;

New BTs.

A pine 12" in diameter bears N 31 W a distance of 179.8 feet, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 21 BT.

A pine 15" in diameter bears N 49 E a distance of 189.5 feet marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 22 BT

I used a steel tape and a magnetic compass with 20 degrees East declination set into the compass.



I placed a nail with a brass washer marked O.P.L.S. 991 at the BT. blaze.

I set a steel fence post with a sign 5.0 feet south of the corner.

Note; I buried the stone on the north of the corner.
