
UNION COUNTY CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established by John H. Hurlburt under GLO Contract Number 201, dated August 5, 1873. Surveyor General record states:
Set a post 4 inches square for 1/4 Sec. Cor.

A 18 inch diameter Pine bears N76°W, 57 Lks. A 18 inch diameter Pine bears S51°E, 61 Lks.



No record of subsequent monumentation found in Union County survey records.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found no evidence of the original corner monument.

See map of Survey Number 028-1992.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At the proportionate position, determined by survey, I 2½"x30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 27 inches in the ground, I set which;

New Bearing Trees;
A 20 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears N44°E, 41.54 feet marked % S12 BT
A 14 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears S64°E, 52.45 feet marked % BT
A 14 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears N74°W, 5.66 feet marked % S11 BT
A 16 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears N85°W, 20.10 feet marked XX BT

Raised a 4 foot base mound of stone to the top of the cap. Set a steel fence post approximately 5 feet South with a 54-9 sign attached.

I hereby certify that the above corner point was perpetuated as hereon described on July 15, 1992.
