Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

A the position of the corner I set a 2" galvanized pipe 30 long and with a 8" plate welded on the bottom. The pipe was set 20" deep with a stone monument around the pipe. A bronze cap was placed on top of pipe.

I stamped the disk

At the position of the corner the original trees are as fillows. A pine 25" in diam bears 339°E 817 feet dist. (scribe visible.)

I set the following new bearing trees:
A pine 17" in diam bears N65°E 38.7 feet marked TaS R36E S18BT.
A pine 10" in diam bears S44°M 11.2 feet dist marked T3S R35E S24BT.

A pine 14" in diam bears Mig W 6.4 feet dist marked T3S R35E S13 BT. (distance measured to center of respective trees and marked with scribe). I set a steel fence post with USFS sign 54-4 attached. National Forest boundary signs were attached to fence post indicating National Forest land to North and East. Bearing trees signs were placed on the bearing trees shoulder high facing the corner.
