
## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

## HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

The corner was originally established by William H. Odell under GLO contract No. 120 dated May 27, 1867. The Surveyor General Record states:

Set 1/4 Sec post cor., deposited marked stone, and raised stone mound as per instructions.



I found no subsequent record of monumentation in the Union County survey records.

## DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:


I found a distinct mound of stones with a decayed wood post in the mound. I could not distinguish any marks on the stones. The mound falls approximately  $17^{\prime}$  south of an east - west fence line.

## DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At the position of the decayed wood in the mound I set a 2 1/4" Brass Cap on a 1 3/8"  $\times$  30" galvanized iron pipe 26" in the ground with a 24"  $\times$  6" mound of stone around it. I stamped the cap as shown below.


I marked four bearing trees. Each bearing tree has a 1 1/2" brass washer fastened between the letters B and T with a 2" PK nail. The washer is stamped WTS and 56295 LS. Measurements were taken to the dent in the head of the nail with a Trimble 5601 electronic total station. Bearings are based on the survey control for County Survey No. 032–2004.

An 18" Ponderosa Pine bears N11°35'07"W, 134.21', scribed 1/4 S30 BT.
A 32" Pondersa Pine bears N40°26'05"E, 134.51', scribed 1/4 S30 BT.
An 18" Pondersa Pine bears S21°40'07"E, 48.07', scribed 1/4 S31 BT.
A 15" Pondersa Pine bears S14°27'13"W, 51.53', scribed 1/4 S31 BT.
