
HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Corner originally established by David P.Thompson under GLO contract no. 103, dated September 3, 1863. Surveyor General record states:

I set post for 1/4 corner to secs 18 and 19 from which:

A pine 18" dia. bears N 72°E, 55 lks.

A larch 8" dia. bears S 20°E, 48 lks.



No record of subsequent monumentation found in Union County survey records.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a 5/8" rebar 28 feet east of corner position, next to a fence corner with fences running East-West & South.

I did not accept the rebar as the corner, see narrative on map of survey.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:


At proportionate position as determined by survey, I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown below, 26" in the ground, from which;

A 12" Douglas Fir bears N 66W, 79.09 feet, marked X BT

A 15" Douglas Fir bears S 26°E, 40.03 feet, marked 1/4 S19 BT

A 10" Tamarack bears S 37°W, 45.90 feet, marked 1/4 S19 BT

A 10" Douglas Fir bears N 43°W, 52.22 feet marked 1/4 S18 BT
