
## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Original Survey by General Land Office, 1863, states:

Set 1/4 sec. post, made mound of earth and drove charred stake as per instructions.

No other records available.



Description of corner evidence found:

No evidence found. The Monument of Record, a 2" iron pipe described in Union County Surveys 1--74 and 33--74 was not found.

Refer to Union County Survey Records.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At the corner location determined as described in a survey performed for the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife, I set a 2"x36" aluminum pipe, 32" in the ground, with magnet-equipped aluminum cap attached, marked:

From which I established the following corner accessories:


An existing 2" iron pipe with threaded cap marked "POINT OF DIVERSION NO. 2", located at the north end of an existing N-S fence, bears S3<sup>0</sup>53'20"W 10.43 feet,

A "+" chiseled on top of the NE corner of a concrete diversion structure, bears  $N32^{\circ}39'40"W$  50.40 feet,

A railroad spike driven vertically in the west base of a multi-stemmed willow tree  $6'\pm$  in diameter, bears N69 $^051'50''$ E 32.88 feet, and

A 5/8"x30" iron rod (rebar) with yellow plastic cap marked "AP&A" attached, set near a railroad tie brace post, bears S82 $^{0}$ 18'20"E 60.70 feet.

Corner is located along the east side of a ditch running north. Accessory ties were made using a theodolite, steel tape, and electronic distance meter.



## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:


Corner originally established by Timothy W. Davenport under GLO contract Number 102, dated July 20,1863. Surveyor General record states:

Set post for qr cor made mound of earth with charred stakes and trenches as per instructions.

Union County surveys 1-74 and 33-74 states found 2" iron pipe in fence corner identified by J.G. Voelz as 1/4 corner.

Union County survey 27-90 states monument of record not found, position projected from survey 33-74 and set a 3" aluminum cap monument.

No record of subsequent monumentation found in Union County Survey Records.



## DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

3" aluminum cap set by survey 27-90. Not accepted See survey Number 034-1998

## DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At the original position of the pipe found by survey number 1-74, determined by survey, I set a 2½"x30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 24 inches in the ground from which:

A 5/8" x 30" iron pin with yellow plastic cap bears N83°E, 14.99 feet marked BGB SURVEY MARKER NE RP.

A 5/8" x 30" iron pin with 1½" aluminum cap bears S47°E, 8.20 feet marked A P & A.

A 2" iron pipe with cap bears S89°W, 45.95 feet marked STOCKHOLM USA.

A 3" aluminum cap bears N78°W, 46.29 feet marked as recorded in Union County survey 27-90.
