HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Corner originally established by David P. Thompson, Contract. 103, dated September, 1863. Surveyor General record states:

Set post for corner to sections 4,5,8 and 9 in mound of earth with charred stake pits trench as per instructions T3S R40E Northwest corner section 9.

Resurvey by Curtis, set stone 6x6x18 for corner to sections 4,5,8 and 9. (Old Book P.110-111) in 1888. On a resurvey of county road made April 14,1892 by J.W. Kimbrell. A corner was found between sections 4,5,8 and 9 which Mr. Kimbrell adopted as the Government corner by evidence from settlers on the land. This corner bears S56°W and

20 links from the corner established by Mr. Kimbrell.

In April and May of 1986, Gary Langlitz found no evidence of the original stone, (survey no 13-86). Langlitz states "we assume that the existing fence running westerly from this location is at the latitudinal position the corner found and accepted in 1892. Therefore we established the corner position in line with the westerly running fence. The offset to the corner from the center of the fence roadway is the result of combining the offset dimension given by Curtis in his October 1891 survey with the departure component of Kimbrell'S tie to the corner in 1892."
DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Newly constructed fence was present and position according to AP&A Survey No. 13-86.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At record position , I set a 5/8"x 30" copper clad with a 2 ½" brass cap, marked as shown below, 31" in the ground From which:

A 5/8"x30" rebar with aluminum cap bears N 50°E, a distance of 48.82 feet, marked NE RP.


A 5/8"x30" rebar with aluminum cap bears S 50°E, a distance of 49.65 feet, marked SE RP.


A 5/8"x30" rebar with aluminum cap bears S 29°W, a distance of 28.73 feet, marked SW RP.


