
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Corner originally established by David Thompson under GLO contract Number 103, dated September 3, Surveyor General record states: 1863.

Set post for 1/4 sec cor in mound of earth, with charred stake, pits, trench as per instructions



No record of subsequent monumentation found in Union County survey records DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found no evidence of the original post or mound of earth as called for in the original notes. I find a 4 way fence corner with ancient fences running South and West, and a newly constructed deer fence running North and East. due to harmony with the adjacent corners of the section, I accept the existing fence corner as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

Along the West side of the existing fence corner, I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 26 inches in the ground, from which;

NEW BEARING TREES AND OBJECT:

A 17" Diameter Ponderosa Pine bears N17°E, 23.31 feet, marked X BT A 5/8"X30" iron pin with aluminum cap marked 1/4 S27 RP bears South, 9.08 feet, set in an existing North-South fence line.

A 18" Diameter Ponderosa Pine bears S79°W, 56.57 feet, marked 1/4 S27 BT


A 15" Diameter Ponderosa Pine bears N63°W, 44.16 feet, marked 1/4 S22 BT

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new accessories. used 20° East declination, the distances are to the center of the aluminum cap of the bearing object and to a 50d spike driven in the right side of the root crown of the bearing trees. I attached a brass washer marked OPLS 2219 to the BT Blaze.
