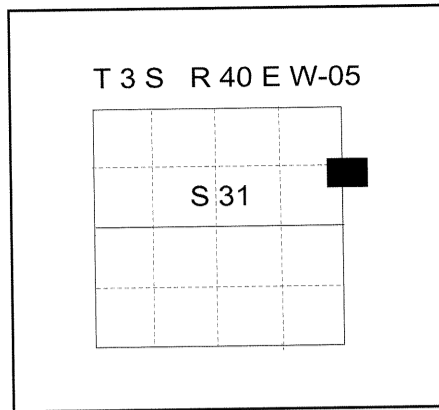


CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Corner originally established by James W. Kimbrell in Old Book Survey Page 7, dated April 8, 1887. Survey Notes state:

Set Stone 6x10x22" for 1/8 corner.



DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

No evidence of Kimbrell stone could be found. A prominent fence corner is harmonious with the bearing and distance as per Kimbrell Survey to the SE corner of Section 31. Fencelines run West and South.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At fence corner position, I set a 5/8" x 30" iron pin, 26" in the ground, with a 2 1/2" aluminum cap, marked as shown below, from which:

A 5/8" x 30" iron pin bears North 89°40' West, a distance of 20.00 feet, with 1 1/2" aluminum cap marked BGB SURVEY MARKER W RP.

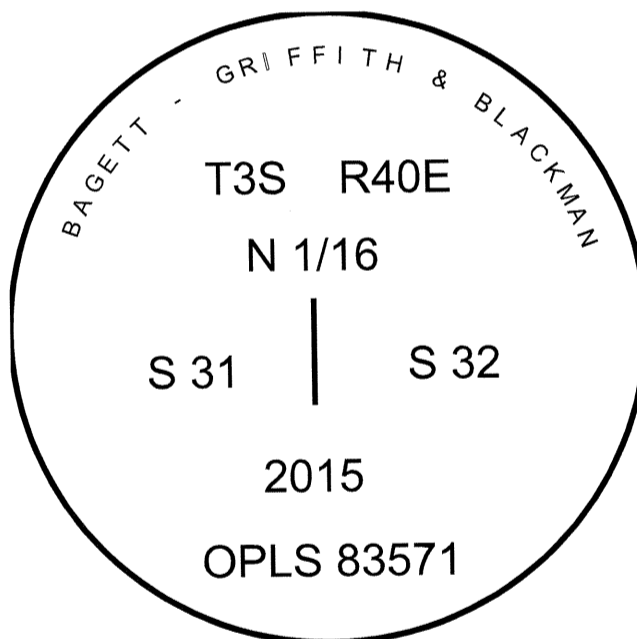
A 5/8" x 30" iron pin bears South 1°00" West, a distance of 20.10 feet, with 1 1/2" aluminum cap marked BGB SURVEY MARKER S RP.

Set a steel fencepost approximately 0.5 feet North of corner monument.
