
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established by W. B. Barr. Surveyor general notes do not record the contract number or the contract date, however the date of the oaths was July 8, 1880. Surveyor General Record states:

 $\frac{1}{4}$ corner being a 14 inch diameter Fir, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on the West and $\frac{1}{4}$ s on the East, from which :

A Fir 20 diameter bears East 20 1ks, dist, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 31 BT.



A Fir 4 inches diameter bears N 10 W, 5 Lks dist, marked 4 S 36 BT.

The west line of 36 was retraced by Alonzo Gesner under contract no 683, dated June 7 1898. He found no 4 corner and found the line to be excessive, he therefor set his own 4 section corner portaining to section 31 only. Description of corner evidence found:

None

No record of subsequent remonumentation found in county records.

See map of survey dated September 1985, filed in the office of the Union County Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner: At proportionate position, I set a 2½ inch x 30 inch aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown 26 inches in the ground. From which:

An 8 inch Tamarack bears S 65 W 20.86 feet marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 BT, on a single blaze.

An 11 inch Tamarack bears N 7 W, 32.14 feet, marked X BT, on a single blaze.

Corner set September 24, 1985. Witness: Rick Robinson, Stratton French.

Set a steel fence post North approximately 5 feet with 54-4 sign attached.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of these accessories. I used 20° East magnetic declination and the distances are to a 50d spike driven in the approximate center of the tree. I set a brass washer marked OPLS 991 at the BT on the blaze. I painted a 6 inch red band around all BTs and attached 54-3 and 54-4 signs.

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHED:

In 1985, Gregory T. Blackman brings this corner to modern standards. Union County Monumentation Record states: At proportionate position, I set a 2 ½ inch x 30 inch aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown 26 inches in the ground. From which:

An 8 inch Tamarack bears S 65 W, 20.86 feet, marked 1/4 S 36 BT, on a single blaze. An 11 inch Tamarack bears N 7 W, 32.14 feet, marked X BT, on a single blaze.

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

A 2 1/2" aluminum pipe with a 3 1/4" aluminum cap, marked as shown below, 2" above ground. From which:

A 9" Western Larch bears South 65° West, a distance of 20.86 feet, alive and vigorous with

scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze. A 13" Western Larch bears North 7° West, a distance of 32.14 feet, alive and vigorous with a healed blaze.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

From the aluminum pipe monument

NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

A 5" Douglas Fir bears South 33° West, a distance of 27.55 feet, marked 1/4 S36 BT. A 3" White Fir bears North 40° West, a distance of 26.45 feet, marked 1/4 S36 BT.

I found a steel fencepost approximately 5 feet North of corner monument.



A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing trees.
