
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established by Alonzo Gesner under GLO contract number 683 dated June 7, 1898. Surveyor General record states:

Set basalt stone 28x14x8 ins for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec cor from which;

A tamarack 28 in diam bears $$63^{\circ}30^{\circ}E$$ 44 1ks dist A noble fir 12 in diam bears $$N3^{\circ}30^{\circ}W$$ 46 1ks dist



No record of subsequent remonumentation found in the county record. Description of corner evidence found:

Stone 20"x13"x8" with broken top and chisle marks at break

A 34° Tamarack stump bears S $63\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E, 44 1ks. Opened stump and found BT scribe. There is also 8 feet of log lying next to stump with blaze evident, I opened blaze and found the scribes.

A stump hole bears N 312 W, 46 1ks.

See map of survey number 29-86 filed in the office of the Union County Surveyor Description of monument and accessories lestablished to perpetuate the original location of this corner: At the stone position, I set a 2½1x3011 aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 28 inches in the ground, from which:

A 25 inch Tamarack bears N 68° E, 68.49 feet, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S29 BT.

A 16 inch Tamarack bears S 50° E 131.12 feet, marked 4 S 32 BT.

Set a steel fence post approximately 5 feet East with a 54-4 sign attached.

Buried stone West of cap.



Brass washer marked OPLS 644 nailed to BT blaze. Used steel tape and magnetic compass with 20° East declination. Distances to the BTs are to a 50d spike set in right side of tree when facing tree, unless otherwise stated.
