
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established by Alonzo Gesner under GLO contract number 683 dated June 7, 1898. Surveyor General record states: Set a basalt stone 16"x14"x3" for closing corner to sections 31 and 32, from which:

A Yellow Pine 26 inches in diameter bears $N_02^{\circ}30^{\circ}$ E, 47 lks. dist A Red Fir, 10 inches in diameter bears N 33 W, 27 lks. dist.



No record of subsequent remonumentation found in county records. Description of corner evidence found:
Found a stone 16"x14"x3" with a "C" visible.

Found a Ponderosa Pine stump badly rotted which bears N 2120 E, 47 1ks.

Found a stump hole N 33° W, 27 1ks.

See map of survey filed number 29-86 in the Union County Surveyors Office. Description of monument and accessories lestablished to perpetuate the original location of this corner: At position determined by survey on the true Township line, I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ 1x30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 24 inches in the ground and raised a mound of stone with a 3 foot base to top of cap from which:

A 7 inch Lodgepole Pine bears N 31° E, 2.31 feet, marked CC S32 BT.

A 9 inch Lodgepole Pine bears N 50° W, 7.65 feet, marked CC \$31 BT.

The original stone was South 0°25'25" East, 2.66 feet from the amended monument Set steel fence post approximately 5 feet East with a 54-9 sign

attached.

The closing cor. of secs. 31 and 32, on the S. bdy. of T. 3 S., R. 41 E., established by Griffith in 1986, recovered and utilized by Griffith in 1988 and by Blackman in 1988, and is accepted as the corner; monumented with an aluminum pipe, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 2 ins. above ground, in a collar of stone, with aluminum cap, 2 1/2 ins. diam., mkd.

An uprooted dead and down lodgepole pine, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 20° E., 2.7 ft. dist., with scribe marks CC S32 $\,$ at waist height and BT at base visible on open blazes with nail and flasher at base.

An uprooted dead and down lodgepole pine, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 62° W., 4.7 ft. dist., with scribe marks CC S31 at waist height and BT at base visible on open blazes with nail and flasher at base.

- 420 E., 8 ins. diam., bears A lodgepole pine, 30.9 ft. dist., mkd. T3S R41E S32 CC BT.
- 310 fir, 6 ins. diam., bears W., A white 17.0 ft. dist., mkd. T3S R41E S31 CC BT.

Remove the marks AM from cap and add the marks BLM 2008.

A metal fence post bears E., 3.5 ft. from the cor.

From this point, the original closing cor. of secs. 31 and 32, T. 3 S., R. 41 E., perpetuated by Griffith in 1986, who found the original stone at this location and reported burying it alongside the aluminum pipe for the closing cor. of secs. 31 and 32, bears S. 0° 25' 24" E., 2.66 ft. dist.; monumented with a 60d nail, with flagging, firmly set, flush with surface of ground, from which the remains of an original bearing tree

A burned rotted stump, size indeterminate, bears N. 2 $1/2^{\circ}$ E., 31.0 ft. dist., with hack marks visible at the base.

At the corner point

Set an iron rod, 5/8 in. diam., 16 ins. long, 16 ins. in the ground. Dispose of the 60d nail.
