

History of original corner establishment:

This corner was established by Frank W. Campbell under contract number 468, on September 16, 1883, as follows:

Set a post with a marked stone for the 1/4 corner for sections 35 and 36, marked 1/4 S on the west face, from which:

A tamarack 18" in diameter bears S 47°E, 20 links (13.2') marked 1/4 S BT.

A fir 18" in diameter bears N 40°W, 25 links (16.5') marked 1/4 S BT.

Description of corner evidence found:

The original 18" tamarack is now an 18" sawn western larch stump. I open the partly healed blaze and find fragmentary scribes and axe marks on the healed over portion of the decayed face. The stump bears S 45°E, 13.2 feet.

The original 18" fir is now a sawn and decayed white fir stump with scribes. "BT", visible on the face and in reverse on the overgrowth wood lying at the base of the stump. The stump bears N 30° W, 16.5 feet.

The original post and marked stone are gone, apparently destroyed by clearcut logging.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At record distance from the recovered bearing tree remnants, I set a 2 1/2" by 30" aluminum pipe, with a 2 1/2" aluminum cap attached, 28" into the ground with a small mound of stones around the pipe. I bury the head of a pulaski along the south side of the monument as a memorial. The cap is marked as shown in the diagram, above, from which:

The monument set by PLS 1638 in 1979 by proportionate measurement bears S 57 W, 53.0 feet.

And bearing trees established by PLS 1638 in 1979:

A 17" spruce with portions of scribing visible on nearly healed double blazes bears S 66° 30' W, 69.5 feet.

A 26" white fir scribed "1/4 S 36 BT" on double blazes bears S 47° 30' W, 79.6 feet. The blazes on this tree are quite high, so I blaze and scribe "BT" just above the ground. I nail a 3/4" brass washer, marked PLS 1636, flush with the new lower blaze between the scribed "B" and "T".

There are no trees to the east, as this area has been clearcut. A north-south road to cabins in section 36 is about 75 feet east of the corner.

History of original corner establishment:

This corner was originally established by Frank W. Campbell under Contract No. 468, on September 16, 1883., as follows:

Set a post with marked stone for the 1/4 corner for sections 35 and 36, marked 1/4 S on the west face, from which:

A tamarack 18" in diameter bears S47 $\stackrel{>}{\sim}$ 20 links (13.2'), marked 1/4 S BT. A fir 18" in diameter bears N 40 W 25 links (16.5') marked 1/4 S BT.

The corner position was re-established in error by LS 1638 in 1979.

The recovered original corner was remonumented by PLS 1636 in 1988. The record for this remonumentation (144-88-R) states:
The original 10" tamarack is now a 18" sawn western larch stump. I open the partiy healed blaze and find fragmentary scribes and axe marks on the healed over portion of the decayed face. The stump bears \$45 \text{E i3.2 feet.} The original 18" fir is how a sawn and decayed white fir stump with scribes "BI", visible on the face and in reverse on the givergrowth wood lying at the base of the stump. The stump bears N 30° N 16.5 feet, the original post and marked stone are gone, apparently destroyed by clearcut logging.

Found 2 1/2" aluminum pipe with 2 1/2" aluminum cap set flush in the ground and surrounded with a mound of earth. The monument and mound are in excellent condition. Cap is marked as shown in corner diagram.

From the recovered corner monument: A 24" sawn western larch stump bears 5.45° E 13.2' with part of face and fragmentary scribes visible (orig. bearing tree). A 24" rotten white fir stump bears N 30°W 16.5' with reverse scribes visible near base of stump (orig. bearing tree).

And the bearing trees established by LS 1638 in 1979: A 18" Englemann spruce bears S 64 1/2°W 70.4' with partly healed double blazes. A 30" white fir bears S 45 1/2°W 78.0' with visible scribes on partly healed

Corner 1, Tract 061405, also being Corner 2, Tract 061407, bears S 57°12'50" W 53.0/.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

The existing corner monument was further referenced as follows:

A 6' steel fence post with sign 54-9 attached bears North 3.8'.

There are no suitable bearing trees to the East so I set a reference monument at a bearing of N 27 $1/2^\circ$ E 13.9' from the corner. The reference monument is a 5/8" by 30" iron pin with 1 1/2" alum. cap marked as shown below. Set steel fence post by reference monument and attached sign 54-3.
