
## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment: Corner established by Rufus S. Moore under General Land office contract no. 451, dated June 12, 1882. Surveyor General Records states: Set basalt stone 18"x9"x7", 12 inches in the ground for corner to sections 7, 8, 17, & 18, marked with 4 notches on S and 5 notches on E edges and railed a mound of stone alongside from which:



A Pine 16" in diameter bears S72°W, 200 1ks. dist. Marked T4S R35E S18 BT.

Corner found by survey number 43-76, work done by Duane I. Griffith, OPLS 644. Plat states; Found GLO corner, Set 3/8"x10" spike at GLO corner.

No record of subsequent remonumentation was found in County Records.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found stone 17''x12''x8'' with notches visible in mound of stone Found spike as per survey number 43-76

Found SV/ BT stump S72°W, 200 1ks. with scribes visible.

Description of monument and accessories lestablished to perpetuate the original location of this corner: In place of spike, I set a 2½'x30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown 12 inches in the ground with surrounding mound of stone from which:

A 16" Ponderosa Pine bears N73°E, 254.04 feet Marked T4S R35E S8 BT


A 10" Ponderosa Pine bears \$64°E, 189.38 feet marked T4S R35E \$17 BT

A 12" Ponderosa Pine bears \$43°W, 147.47 feet marked T4S R35E \$18 BT

An  $18^{\prime\prime}$  Ponderosa Pine bears N73 $^{\rm O}$ W, 133.91 feet marked T4S R35E S7 BT

Buried original stone North Set a steel fence post approximately 5 feet North with 54-4 sign attached.
