Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set a 2"x30" aluminum pipe with a 2%" aluminum cap, marked as shown in the diagram, 22" in the ground to hard pan, at a point as determined by the procedures set forth in the MANUAL OF INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SURVEY OF PUBLIC LANDS for the subdivision of sections. Built a mound of rock & earth to be 30" in diameter by 6" high around the monument, from which new BTs are:

24 Ponderosa pine bears S55 30 N, 206.0 feet scribed CN1/16 S17 BT

22 Ponderosa pine bears S64 15'E, 254.0 feet scribed CN1/16 S17 B7

Attached BT and Land Survey Monument signs to and painted a red band around each BT. Bearings were turned from the control traverse with a theodolite, basis of bearing being the bearing between the SE and S% corners of Section 7 as shown on MOS 43-76, to stamped brass washers nailed in the scribed red-painted blazes. Distances were measured from a 60d spike, with an aluminum washer stamped PLS 699, which was driven into the side of each BT approximately one foot above the ground. Set steel fence posts 5 feet N and 5 feet E of the corner on the National Forest boundary lines. Attached Forest Boundary signs to each post and a Land Survey Monument sign to the N post.
