Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set a 2"x30" aluminum pipe with a 2%" aluminum cap, marked as shown in the diagram, 14" in the ground to solid rock, at a point as determined by the procedures set forth in the MANUAL OF INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SURVEY OF PUBLIC LANDS for the subdivision of sections. Built a mound of rock to be 36" in diameter by 16" high around the monument, from which new BTs are:

11° Pouderosa pine bears N20° 45'E, 79.0 feet scribed C1/4 S17 BT

10° Ponderosa pine bears NO1° 45°E, 73.2 feet scribed C1/4 S17 BT
Attached BT and Land Survey Monument signs to and painted a red band around each BT. Bearings were turned from the control traverse with a theodolite, basis of bearing being the bearing between the SE and S quarter corners of Section 7 as shown on MOS 43-76, to stamped brass washers nailed in the scribed red-painted blazes. Distances were measured from a 60d spike, with an aluminum washer stamped PLS 699, which was driven into the side of each BT approximately one foot above the ground. Set a steel fence post 5 feet S of the corner with a Land Survey Monument sign attached. The monument is not a National Forest property corner.
