
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment: Corner established by Rufus S. Moore under General Land office contract no. 451, dated June 12, 1882. Surveyor General Records states: Set Basalt Stone 14"x10", 10 inches in the ground for 4 section corner marked 4 on North face from which:

A Pine 34 inches in diameter bears $N25^{\circ}W$, 106 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{3}$ BT.



No record of subsequent remonumentation was found in County Records. Description of corner evidence found:

Found SW BT, a 24" stump, no scribes visible, S77°W, 591ks.

Found NW BT, a 37" Ponderosa Pine, alive and vigerous, scribe visible N25°W, 106 1ks.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner: At record bearing and distance from the found BTs, I set a 2½1×30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 15" in the ground with surrounding mound of stone, from which:


A 14" Ponderosa Pine bears \$24°W, 86.57 feet, marked 4\$ 24 BT

Set a steel fence post approximately 5 feet East with 54-4 sign attached.

Corner set 10/3/85

Brass washer nailed to BT blaze. Used steel tape and magnetic compass with 20° East declination. Measured to 50d spike set in right side of tree when facing tree, unless otherwise stated.
