
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment: Corner established by Rufus S. Moore under General Land office contract no. 451, dated June 12, 1882. Surveyor General Records states:

Set a basalt stone 14"x10"x6", 10 inches in the ground for 4 section corner, marked 4 on W face from which:

A Pine 15" in diameter bears S88°E 29.1ks dist. marked 4 S BT

A Pine 36" in diameter bears \$350W 5 1ks. dist. marked 48 BT



No record of subsequent remonumentation was found in County Records.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found 30" Ponderosa Pine S88°E, 19.1 feet, alive and vigerous, blaze evident.

Found 36" Ponderosa Pine snag \$350W, 3.3 feet, burned with scribes visible.

original location of this corner: At record bearing and distance from the BTs, I set a $2^12^1\times30^{11}$ aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 30^{11} in ghe ground with surrounding mound of stone, from which:

A 13" Douglas Fir bears N3 W, 36.80 feet, marked 4 S 29 BT

Corner set 10/19/85
Set steel fence post approximately 5 feet North with 54-4 sign attached.
