History of original corner establishment: Corner established in 1881 by Jacob C. Cooper under General Land Office contract no. 387. Surveyor General Notes State;

Set post $3\frac{1}{2}$ feet long 4 inches square 1 foot in the ground, marked T 4 S, S 6 on NE, R 36 E S 7 on SE, R 35 E S 12 on SW. and S 1 on NW faces, with 5 notches on south and 1 notch on North edges, from which;

A pine 12 inches diameter bears S 35 W, 32 lks. distant, marked T 4 S. R 35 E S 12, BT.

A pine 10 inches diameter bears S 76 E,471ks distant, marked T 4 S. R 36 E. S 6, BT.

A pine 12 inches diameter bears N 42 W 18 lks. distant, marked T 4 S R 35 E, S 1, BT.

An additional tree was taken by the surveyor who surveyed the interior of T 4 S R. 36 E., His notes State;

A pine 40 inches diameter bears N 22 E 150 Lks. distant, Marked T 4 S,R 36 E, S 6 BT.

Description of their subsequent: remonumentation found in county records.

- NE. bearing tree, dead and standing, scribes visible, at called distance and bearing.
- SE. bearing tree, Stump, scribes visible, at called distance and bearing.
- SW. bearing tree, dead and standing, scribes visible, at called distance and bearing.

NW. bearing tree, dead and standing, blaze scar visible, at called bearing, however I found the distance to be 19.00 feet instead of 18 lks. (11.9 feet)

Found the rotten remains of the original post in the ground, at the intersection of the record bearings and distances of the NE., SE. and the SW. BTs.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner. At the location of the remains of the post in the ground , I set a $2\frac{1}{12}$ x 30 inch iron pipe with brass cap marked as shown, 24 inches in the ground from which NEW BT s.

A 13 inch fir bears N 83 E a distance of 30.6 feet, marked T 48 R 36 E S6 BT.

 Λ 11 inch fir bears S 15 E $^{\circ}$ a distance of 54.4 feet, marked T 4 S, R 36 E S 7 BT.

A 11 inch Fir bears S 21-30 W a distance of 68.4 feet, marked T 4 R 35 E S 12 BT.

No other living trees available within limits in the NW quadrant.


