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

History of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established by Herman D. Gradon under GLO contract number 452, dated June 16, 1882. Surveyor General record states:

Set a basalt stone 14x8x5 ins 12 ins in the ground for cor to secs 10, 11, 14 & 15 marked with 4 notches on S and 2 notch on E edges from which;

A fir 8 ins diam bears N45°E 63 lks dist marked T4S R36E S11 BT A pine 10 ins diam bears S70°E 54 lks dist marked T4S R36E S14 BT A fir 20 ins diam bears S5°W 60 lks dist marked T4S R36E S15 BT A pine 18 ins diam bears N45°W 28 lks dist marked T4S R36E S10 BT



No record of subsequent monumentation found in Union County survey records.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a broken stone 15x8x5 inches broken in two pieces, marked with 4 chiseled grooves.

Found a stump hole N45°E, 63 lks

Found a badly rotted pine stump, loose on the ground with scribes visible. Stump came from stump hole S70°E, 54 lks

Found a stump hole S5°W, 60 lks

Found a 20 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine stump N45°W, 28 lks with chop marks and blaze evident—no scribes visible.

A 8 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears N41½°W, 58.18 feet marked T4S R36E S10 BT

Raised a mound of stone around monument, 2 ft. base to top of cap. Buried the original corner stone North and alongside monument.

Painted a 6 inch red band around all BTs and attached Bearing Tree and Land Survey Monument signs.
