
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At position determined by survey I set a 25" x 30" aluminum pipe with 25" cap marked as shown below, 27" in the ground, with a ring of stone, from which:

- A 13" Ponderosa Pine bears N7°E, 15.44 feet, marked S32 BT.
- A 18" Ponderosa Pine bears S37°E, 36.48 feet, marked X BT. A 16" Ponderosa Pine bears S66°W, 42.55 feet, marked W1/16 S5 BT.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new accessories. I used 18° East declination, the distances are to a 60d spike driven into the root crown at the right side of the bearing trees. Attached brass washer marked OPLS 2625 to BT blaze.


CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

The corner was originally established by Jeffery P. Petersen under Union County Survey 022–1996. His Record States:

At position determined by survey I set a 2 1/2" x 30" aluminum pipe with a 2 1/2" cap 27" in the ground, with a ring of stone, from which:

13" Ponderosa Pine bears N7°E, 15.44 feet, marked S32 BT. 18" Ponderosa Pine bears S37°E, 36.48 feet, marked X BT. 16" Ponderosa Pine bears S66°W, 42.55 feet, marked W1/16 S5 BT.



I found no subsequent record of monumentation in the Union County survey records.

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

I found the pipe as described at the northwest corner of a large rock jack with fences running East and South. The BT's were alive and in good condition with healing blazes.


DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

The survey by Peterson has an erroneous location for the south 1/4 corner of Section 32. The monument for that 1/4 corner is in it's correct location as identified by the BT's so I assume the error is in the measurements of it's location. Because of this error, the location determined for the West 1/16th of Section 5 is also in error. I therefore did not hold the location of Petersen's monument.

At the correct location for the West 1/16th corner on the North line of Section 5 I set a 1"x24" iron rebar 18" in the ground with a 2" aluminum cap stamped as shown below. I made a small collar of stone around the cap.

For bearing trees I used the existing bearing trees set by Petersen. I made no additional marks on these trees. The measurements were made to the nail in the center of Mr. Petersen's brass washer with a Trimple 5601 electronic total station. The bearings on this certificate are based on the survey control for County Survey 032-2004.

An 18" Ponderosa Pine bears S63 24'44"E, 26.09' with healing blazes.
An 18" Ponderosa Pine bears S86°13'12"W, 38.01', with healing blazes. The aluminum monument set by Petersen bears NO *28'59"W, 15.38'.
