




I marked two bearing trees. Each bearing tree has a copper nail with a 1 1/8" head stamped WTS and 56295LS driven between the letters B & T.

I found the 1" repar with aluminum cap and the bearing trees as described in good condition.




DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

Since my survey 032-2004 two additional original corner monuments have been found. To correct my corner location, I removed the cap from the 1" iron repar but left the repar in place.

At the correct corner position I set a 1" imes 24" iron pipe with a 2" aluminum cap attached flush with the surface of the ground. The cap was stamped as shown below:

I held the two bearing trees I had previously set. Each bearing tree has a copper nail with a 1 1/8" head stamped WTS and 56295LS driven between the letters B & T. Measurements were taken to the dent in the head of the nail with a Trimble 5601 electronic total station. Bearings are based on the survey control for County Survey 032-2004. The bearing trees are now described as follows:

A 13" Ponderosa Pine bears N45 $^{\circ}31'30"\text{W},\ 27.31',\ \text{scribed CW 1/16 S5 BT}.$ A 14" White Fir bears S39 $^{\circ}03'29"\text{E},\ 82.22',\ \text{scribed CW 1/16 S5 BT}$ The 1" rebar bears S84 $^{\circ}48'34"\text{E},\ 26.53'.$
