

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Corner originally established by Herman D. Gradon under GLO contract Number 452, dated June 6, 1882. Surveyor General record states:

Set basalt stone 14x14x3", 9 ins. In the ground for 1/4 sec cor. marked 1/4 on W. face from which: A pine 20 ins diam bears N 20° W 75 lks dist marked 1/4

A pine 20 ins diam bears N 20° W 75 lks dist marked 1/4 SBT. No other tree within limits and raised a mound of stone alongside.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At position determined by survey, I set a $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" Aluminum pipe, with aluminum cap marked as shown, 24" in the ground, with 2 ft. wide mound of stone, from which:

A 19" Western Larch bears North 15° East, a distance of 73.35 feet, marked 1/4 S3 BT. An 11" Ponderosa Pine bears South 18° East, a distance of 27.22 feet, marked 1/4 S3 BT. A 6" Ponderosa Pine bears South 46° West, a distance of 52.00 feet, marked X BT. A 12" Ponderosa Pine bears North 35° West, a distance of 34.68 feet, marked 1/4 S4 BT.

Set a steel fencepost 1 feet North of corner. Corner falls 20 feet West of a North/South running creek.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the bearing trees. I used 18° East declination. I attached a brass washer marked OPLS 2219 to the BT blaze. The distance is to a 60d spike driven into the root crown at the right side of the new bearing tree.
