History of original corner establishment:


Corner originally established by Herman Gradon under Contract No.452, dated June 16, 1882.

Surveyor General records state:

Set a basalt stone $14 \times 14 \times 7$ ins 9 ins in the ground for 1/4 Sec Cor marked 1/4 on W face from which:

A pine ll ins diam bears N40°E, 60 lks dist marked 1/4S BT.


A pine 24 ins diam bears S68°W, 10 lks dist marked 1/4S BT.



Description of corner evidence found:

Found a 12 x 10 x 8" basalt stone marked with poor "1/4" on West face from which:

A root hole depression brs S68°W, 6.6', no other traces remain of the original BTs.



Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At position of found stone...


Set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap on $2\frac{1}{2}$ x 30" aluminum pipe 24" in ground, surrounded with mound of earth and stone & 6' steel fence post North of corner with sign 54-9 attached. Cap marked as shown in corner diagram. Buried corner stone in mound.

New bearing trees established: A 10" ponderosa pine brs S9 $^{\rm O}$ E, 115.4' scribed 1/4S10 BT. A 14" ponderosa pine brs N54 $^{\rm L}$ 0W, 59.9' scribed 1/4S9 BT.

New BTs have a brass washer stamped PLS 1106 nailed to face of blaze. Attached sign 54-3 & 54-9, painted face of blaze & a 6" red band around each BT.

Compass declination 190 East.
