

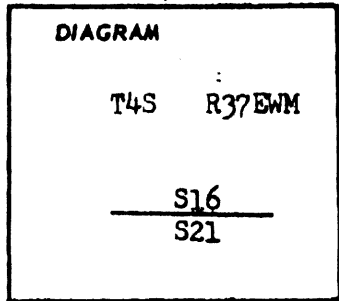

History of original corner establishment:  
Original Survey by General Land Office (Contract Survey 1882)



The original notes read; Set a post from which:  
A fir 10" in diam bears N15°E 10 lks dist marked  $\frac{1}{4}$ SBT;  
A fir 8" in diam bears S20°W 9 lks dist marked  $\frac{1}{4}$ SBT:

Description of corner evidence found:

Found- A fir 10" in diam bears N15°E 10 lks dist with blaze scar.  
Found Fir 13" in diam bears S20°W 9 lks dist with scribe visible.

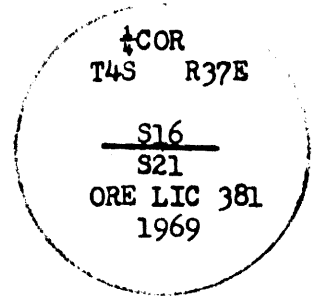

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

At the position of the corner I set A galvanized pipe 30" long with a bronze cap on top and 8" plate welded to bottom. Pipe set to a depth of 21" and backfilled with stone and soil

I stamped the disk



From the position of the corner the original bearing trees are; A fir 10" in diam bears N15°E 10 lks dist.  
A fir 13" in diam bears S20°W 9 lks dist.;  
I set a steel fence post with USFS sign 544 attached;  
I placed a National Forest Boundary sign on the post indicating National Forest Land to South. Bearing tree signs were placed on bearing trees shoulder high facing the corner.
