## Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At the corner point as reestablished from the two original bearing trees, set 2½" brass cap on 1½" dia. galv. iron pipe, 30" long, 20" into the ground.

From the corner point:

A 17" dia. Louglas Fir bears N 10 E, 31.3 ft. dist. marked % S6 BT.

 $\lambda$  14" dia. Douglas Fir bears S 64 E, 49.1 ft. dist. marked ¼ S6 BT.

Set a steel fence post alongside the monument, painted the blazes on the bearing trees red, and attached a brass I. D. washer between the B and T scribes.
