History of original corner establishment:

The original survey of Township 4 South, Pange 38 East was performed by L. B. Barr under contract No. 388, dated May 7, 1881. GLO record states:

Marked basalt rock 18" x 14" x 10" from which:

A pine 36" dia. bears 5 27 L 49 lks. dist.

A pine 20" dia. bears A 2 ¼ 70 lks. dist.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found well set stone 18" x 14" x 10" with faint % on south face. From which:

A 24" dia. burned and rotted Ponderosa Fine stump bears N 2 W 46.2 ft. dist. marked with chop marks.

A 36" dia. burned and rotted Ponderosa Pine bears S 42 E 9.3 ft. dist. marked with chop marks and partial scribing.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At the point of the recovered stone, set 2½" brass cap on 1¼" dia. galv. iron pipe, 30" long, 24" into the ground with 36" dia. stone mound. Leposited the original stone 1' north of the monument in the stone mound. From the corner point:

A 10" White Fir bears N 60 W 29.6 ft. dist. marked % S6 BT

A 16" Tamarack bears S 40 E 45.5 ft. dist. marked ¼ S7 BT

Set a steel fence post alongside the monument, painted the blazes on the bearing trees red, and attached a brass I. D. washer between the B and T scribes.
