

A 10 inch diameter Lodgepole Pine bears S 70°E, a distance of 40.86 feet, marked C1/4 S32 BT

A 5/8"x30" iron pin with 1 1/2" aluminum cap marked "BGB SURVEY MARKER SW RP" bears S 40°14'W, a distance of 16.47 feet,


