

Found a stone 14x10x10 inches at record distances from bearing trees. No marks visible.

Found Southwest bearing tree high stumped and in N-S fence line Stump in now 13" and bears N80°W, 173 lks. on the slope. Scribes visible.

Found down and rotted remains of Southeast bearing tree. Bearing \$33°E 154 lks. on the slope. Double blaze evident on bark remains.

A 20 inch Ponderosa Pine bears N6°W, 72.25 feet marked ¼ S35 BT

Painted a 6 inch red band around all BTs and attached bearing tree and land survey monument signs.

Set a steel fencepost approximately 5 feet North with attention sign attached.

Buried the original corner stone East and alongside of monument. Raised mound of stone around monument, 3 ft. base to top of cap.



An 8 inch diameter Mahogany bears S23°W, 39.16 feet, marked X BT.

An 8 inch Ponderosa Pine bears N60°W, 29.60 feet, marked X BT. A 20 inch Ponderosa Pine bears N6°W, 72.25 feet, marked 1/4 S35 BT.

#### DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found 2 ½" aluminum pipe with 2 ½" aluminum cap marked as shown below, 9 inches above ground in a mound of stone 2 ft. diam., from which:

A 26 inch Ponderosa Pine bears North 2° West, a distance of 72.25 feet, alive and vigorous with healed blaze.

A 16 inch Ponderosa Pine bears South 71° East, a distance of 50.10 feet, alive and vigorous with healed blaze.

A 12 inch Ponderosa Pine bears North 54° West, a distance of 29.60 feet, alive and vigorous with healed blaze.

The Southwest bearing tree is dead standing with scribe marks visible.
