History of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established by Henry M. Thatcher under GLO contract number 320 dated April 1, 1879. Surveyor General record states:


Set stone 13x8x6 for cor to secs 5,6,31 and 32 from which;

A fir 12 in dia bears N10°E 9 1ks dist

A fir 14 in dia bears \$15E 9 1ks dist

A tamarack 16 in dia bears S60W 12 1ks dist

A fir 10 in dia bears N45°V 121ks dist



Corner was retraced by Alonzo Gesner under GLO contract number 683 dated June 7, 1898. Surveyor General record states; Found corner to secs 5,6,31 and 32 a stone 5x6x5 inches above ground from which; A fir 12 in diam bears N3°E 9 lks dist, A fir 14 in diam bears $$8^{\circ}E$ 9 1ks dist, A tamarack 16 in diam bears $$62^{\circ}30^{\circ}W$ 5 1ks dist, A fir 10 in diam bears $$N45^{\circ}W$ 12 1ks dist.

After retracing this line, Mr. Gesner called the corner out of the acceptable limits for clasure and returned to obliterate the BTs to the North and set a closing Corner East Description of corner evidence found:

Found a stone $14^{11}x8^{11}x6^{11}$ with 5 grooves and 1 groove in a mound of stone. Found a stump hole that bears N 10^{0} E, 9 lks.

A 20 inch Fir dead and down, rotting with chop marks visible, bears \$ 15° E, 9 1ks.

Found a 22 inch Tamarack stump with bottom of blaze evident, bears S 60° W, 5 lks. Found a stump hole that bears N 45° W, 12 lks.

original location of this corner: At stone position I set a 2½1x301 aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown 28 inches in the ground and raised a mound of stone with a 3 foot base to top of cap, from which:

A 6 inch Tamarack bears S 60° E, 14.76 feet, marked X BT.


An 18 inch Double Bole White Fir bears \$ 54° W, 26.25 feet, marked T4\$ R41E \$6 BT. A 50d spike is in the left root crown when facing tree.

Buried stone to the North of the cap.

Set a steel fence post approximately 5 feet East with a 54-9 sign attached.
