
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established by Henry M. Thatcher under GLO contract number 320 dated April 1, 1879. Surveyor General record states:


Set a black pine post 4 ft long 4 in. in dia for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec cor from which:

A black pine 5 in dia bears $N12^{O}W$ 10 1ks dist A black pine 5 in dia bears $S35^{O}E$ 18 1ks dist



No record of subsequent remonumentation found in County records. Description of corner evidence found:

None.



See map of survey number 29-86 as recorded in the office of the Union County Surveyor Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner: At proportionate position, I set a 2½x30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 28 inches in the ground; from which;

A 6 inch Lodgepole Pine bears N 24° E, 16.25 feet, marked X BT.

A 6 inch Tamarack bears \$ 40° W, 29.12 feet, marked X BT.

Set a steel fence post approximately 5 feet North with a 54-4 sign attached.


