
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original comer establishment: Corner originally established by Henry M. Thatcher under GLO contract number 320 dated April 1, 1879. Surveyor General record states:


Marked a fir 5 in dia for 4 sec cor from which;

A pine 6 in dia bears $$20^{\circ}E$ 23 lks dist A fir 7 in dia bears $$N35^{\circ}W$ 41 lks dist



No record of subsequent remonumentation found in county records. Description of corner evidence found:

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner: At the proportionate position, I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ 1x3011 aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 24 inches in the ground, from which:

An 8 inch Spruce bears S 35° E, 26.52 feet, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S10 BT.

A 6 inch Tamarack bears S 34° W, 27.41 feet, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S9 Bt.

Set a steed fence post approximately 5 feet North with a 54-9 sign attached.


