
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:
Corner originally established by Henry M. Thatcher under GLO contract number 320 dated April 1, 1879. Surveyor General record states:

Set stone 15x11x9 for 4 sec cor from which:

A spruce 12 in dia bears N60°E 8 1ks dist A black pine 13 in dia bears S26°E 10 1ks dist



No record of subsequent monumentation found in county records Description of corner evidence found:

Found a stone 15x9x8 inches with faint marks

Found a 24 inch diameter spruce stump $N60^{\rm O}E$ 8 lks cut too low to see blaze or scribes Found a 12 inch diameter Lodgepose Pine S26°E 10 lks dead down rotting with scribes visible

Description of monument and accessories l'established to perpetuate the original location of this corner: In place of stone, I set a $2\frac{1}{2} \times 30^{11}$ aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown 28 inches in the ground from which:


New BTs

A 11 inch diameter Spruce bears N89°E 18.36 feet marked 4 S15 BT A 21 inch diameter Tamarack bears S44°W 36.45 feet marked 4 S22 BT

Buried the original stone South and alongside of monument Set steel fencepost approximately 5 feet. East with 54-9 sign attached

Corner monumented June 19, 1986 Witnesses: Greg Blackman and Rick Robinson





Brass washer marked OPLS 644 nailed to BT blaze. Used steel tape and magnetic compass with 20° East declination. Distances to the BTs are to a 50d spike set in right side of tree when facing tree, unless otherwise stated.
