


History of original corner establishment:
Corner originally established by Henry M. Thatcher under GLO contract number 320 dated April 1, 1879. Surveyor General record states:

Set stone 19x15x7 for 4 sec cor Raised stone mound at cor



No record of subsequent monumentation found in county records Description of corner evidence found:

Found a stone 19x12x8 broken into 3 pieces, marked $\frac{1}{4}S$ on the 2 smaller pieces, in mound of stone



Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner: In place of stone, I set a 2½1x30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, buried 15 inches in the ground with mound of stone 4 ft base to top of cap, from which;

A 6 inch diameter Lodgepole Pine bears S47°E 36.58 feet marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S28 BT A 19 inch diameter P.Pine bears S61°W 47.35 feet marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S29 BT


Buried the original stone South and alongside of monument Set steel fencepost approximately 5 feet South with 54-9 sign

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

Corner originally established by Henry M. Thatcher under GLO contract number 320, dated April 1, 1879. Surveyor General record states:

Set stone 19x15x7 for 1/4 sec. cor.

In 1986, Duane Griffith finds original GLO stone in Survey Number 31-86 and brings monument to county standard. Union County Monumentation record states:

In place of stone, I set a $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 15 inches in the ground with mound of stone 4 ft base to top of cap, from which:

A 6 inch diameter lodgepole pine bears S47°E 36.58 feet marked 1/4 S28 BT.

A 19 inch diameter P. Pine bears S61°W 47.35 feet marked 1/4 S29 BT.

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Aluminum pipe with 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " cap, marked as shown below, 12" above ground in a mound of stone 4 feet diameter, from which:

A Lodgepole Pine bears South 46° East, a distance of 36 feet, dead and leaning with partially healed blaze.

A 22 inch Ponderosa Pine bears South 61° West, a distance of 47.35 alive and vigorous with healed blaze.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

From the corner monument position,

NEW BEARING TREES

A 9 inch Western Larch bears North 2° East, a distance of 47.10 feet, marked 1/4 S28 BT. A 6 inch Douglas Fir bears South 65° East, a distance of 51.80 feet, marked 1/4 S28 BT. A 10 inch Douglas Fir bears North 37° West, a distance of 62.65 feet, marked 1/4 S29 BT.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new accessories. I used 16° East declination, the distances are to a 60d spike driven into the root crown at the right side of the bearing trees. I place a brass washer marked OPLS 83571 in the lower blaze of the new accessories.
