HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHMENT!

Corner originally established by GLO Contract number 235 by John H. Stone dated July 6, 1875. GLO Record states:

Set stone 16x12x7 as per instructions for 1/4 sec

Survey number 29-88 places the corner position by proportion, but did not set a monument.

No record of subsequent monumentation found in UNION COUNTY survey records.

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found no evidence of the original GLO Corner monument. See Survey Number 031-2000.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

At the position determined by survey number 031-2000, I set a 24 x30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown below, 30" in the ground, from which:


A 5/8"x30" iron pin with 12" aluminum cap marked NE RP bears North 37° East, a distance of 6.75 feet.


A 5/8"x30" iron pin with 14" aluminum cap marked SE RP bears South 19° East,

A 5/8"X30" from pin with 14" aluminum cap marked SE RP pears South 19 East, a distance of 50.20 feet. (Pin falls in existing East-West fence line)
A 5/8"x30" iron pin with 14" aluminum cap marked SW RP bears South 43° West, a distance of 51.70 feet. (Pin falls in existing East-West fence line)
A 5/8"x30" iron pin with 14" aluminum cap marked NW RP bears North 47° West, a distance of 9.76 feet.

Set a steel fence post approximately 2 feet North of the monument.
