

Pieces of a Lodgepole Pine log, loose, 6" (6") diam., bears N36°W (N35 $1/2^{\circ}$ W), a distance of 23 ft. (23.33 ft.), scribed "/1689 BT" visible, and brass washer marked "LS 645" nailed below the "BT".

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

From the existing brass cap I established the following new BT's: A Lodgepole Pine, 6" diam., bears N61°E, a distance of 5.3 ft., scribed "XBT", with a brass washer marked "LS 2211" nailed between the B & T.
