CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner was established in 1882, by Rufus S. Moore, under General Land Office Contract No. 451. Surveyor General's records state: Set a post 3 ft. long, 3 in. square and 24in. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ corner, marked 1/4 S on the W. face, from which: A pine 8" dia. bears S 60 W, 56 lks. dist. marked A pine 24" dia. bears N 08 E, 10 lks. dist. marked 1 S BT.

Description of corner evidence found:

At assumed corner location I found no trace of the wood post as previously described. However I did find a 24" pine stump with traces of a blaze, though the tree was cut below the scribing. This tree was in Section 9. There was no trace of the 8" tree as described and being in Section 16.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

As the evidence in the vicinity of the corner agrees with the GLO original record, at the location reconstructed from the position of the original bearing tree, I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ brass cap on a 30 galv. iron pipe, and being stamped as shown above, with a large mound of stone and dirt around, and of which buried the monument.

New bearing trees: A pine 7" in dia. bears N 55 E, 21.0 feet and scribed $\frac{1}{4}$ S S 9 Bt. A pine 8" dia. bears S 38 E, 55.0 feet and scribed $\frac{1}{4}$ S S 16 BT.
