Description of corner evidence found:

At assumed corner location I found a basalt stone 13 x 8 x 8 lying on the surface, with 2 notches faintly on two edges, also a mound of stone along side. I found evidence of a badly rotted pine tree that bears N 16 W, 306 lks. dist. from the stone.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

As the evidence in the vicinity of the corner agrees with the GLO original record, at the center of the marked stone I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " brass cap on a 30" galv. iron pipe, and being stamped as shown above; I placed the 13 x 8 x 8 stone along side the monument and buried both in a large mound of stone and dirt.
