
## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment: Corner established by Jacob C. Cooper under General Land Office contract no. 397, dated July 1, 1881. Surveyor General Records states: Set post 3½ feet long 3 inches square 18inches in the ground on West side of ridge 90 feet below summit in open pine timber undergrowth the same for ¼ section corner marked ¼S on North and South faces. From Which:




A Tamarack 30 inches diameter bears N89°E 40 1ks. distant, marked 4SBT

A Fir 18 inches in diameter bears \$710W, 49 lks. distant, marked \$\sqrt{8}BT.

No record of subsequent remonumentation was found in County Records. Description of corner evidence found:

Found Northeast BT, a 32" Tamarack. I opened and found scribing. No evidence of corner or other BT.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At record bearing and distance from the found BT, I set a  $2\frac{1}{2}\times30^{\circ}$  aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown below, 30 inches in the ground, with mound of stone surrounding cap, from which:


A 12" Ponderosa Pine bears \$27°W, 51.24 feet marked 15 5 BT

A 13" Douglas Fir bears N53 $^{\rm O}$ V, 10.20 feet marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  \$ 32 BT

Set steel fence post approximately 5 feet west with 54-4 sign attached.

Corner set 10/21/85 Witness: Stratton French





Brass washer nailed to BT blaze. Used steel tape and magnetic compass with 20° East declination. Measured to 50d spike set in right side of tree when facing tree, unless otherwise stated.
