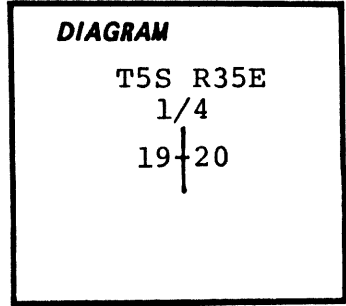


CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

Index File No. P-05

History of original corner establishment:

In 1882, under Contract No. 481, Rufus S. Moore set a post, from which an 18" Pine bears N43°E, 197 lks. and pits were dug north and south of the post at a distance of 5.5 ft.



Description of corner evidence found:

No corner monument found.

Bearing trees found:

A 24" L. Pine bears N43°E, 130.0 ft., with blazed face, badly rotted with no scribing. On it was a location poster dated 1946 and marked: Fd BT.

Description of monument and accessories established to perpetuate the original location of this corner: Cap is stamped:

Set 2.5" aluminum cap on 2"x30" aluminum pipe rising 6" above ground. Set steel fence post 3.0 ft. north of corner.

New BT's:

A 16" L. Pine bears N48°04'E, 262.5 ft., scribed: 1/4 S20 BT.
A 9" L. Pine bears S26°53'W, 642.9 ft., scribed: 1/4 S19 BT.

Attached brass disk stamped LS 1844 to base of blazes. Painted blazes and attached signs as per Standard Specifications for Cadastral Surveys, USFS Region 6, March 1982.

Corner is found 125 ft. south of fence in swampy area. Location posters on fence posts. 1000 ft. west of road 5155.
