Corner originally established in 1984 by David E. Scott, RLS 1844, under U.S. Forest Service contract. Excerpts from Scott's notes state:

Set a 2.5" aluminum cap on  $2\ 3/8$ " x 30" aluminum pipe rising 6" above ground. Set steel fence post 3.0 ft. So. of corner. Cap is marked as shown in corner diagram.

New BT's:

Found a 2 1/2" diameter aluminum cap on an aluminum pipe, 6" above the ground. A steel fence post with 54-2 and 54-9 signs is 1.8' south of monument.

From which:

A Lodgepole Pine snag, 6' high and 12" in diameter bears S19°E, 12.7' with burnt face and faint scribing.

A Lodgepole Pine snag, 13" in diameter bears S38°W (Record S44.5°W), 57.3' (Record 57.0') scribed N 1/16 S36 BT, with a brass washer between the B and T.

# Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

New bearing trees:

A Lodgepole Pine 9" in diameter bears S82°E, 136.8' scribed N 1/16 S31 BT. A Lodgepole Pine 7" in diameter bears S48°W, 70.2' scribed X BT.

The new bearing trees have a 30d spike in the right side center and a brass disc stamped PLS 2672 placed between the B and T on the lower face, All bearing trees have 54-3 and 54-9 signs, a 6" red painted band, and bearing tree face painted red.

The corner monument is 2' south of an east—west fence. Area burned by the Fly Fire in 2005.
