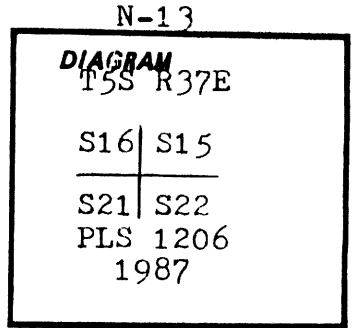


CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

William R. Gradon conducted the survey of Township 5 South, Range 37 East, W.M., under contract No. 445 dated June 1, 1882.



Gradon set a basalt stone 24" x 10" x 5", 18" into the ground, marked with 3 notches on the South and East edges, from which:

- A black pine 10" dia. bears N 5 E at 212 lks. dist.
- A black pine 12" dia. bears S 35 E at 40 lks. dist.
- A black pine 10" dia. bears S 50 W at 38 lks. dist.
- A black pine 13" dia. bears N 65 W at 50 lks. dist.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a Basalt stone 18" x 13" x 4", marked with 3 grooves on the South side and 3 grooves on the East side.

BT's-

- A rotted tree, size indeterminable, bears N. 5° E. at 140 ft. dist., mkd. T5S R37E S 15 / BT.
- A root hole bears S. 35° E. at 26.4 ft. dist.
- A rotted tree, size indeterminable, bears S. 50° W. at 25.1 ft. dist., mkd. S 21 / BT.
- A rotted tree, size indeterminable, bears N. 65° W. at 33.0 ft. dist., mkd. / BT.

Description of monument and accessories established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

In place of the original corner stone, set a 2½" x 30" aluminum pipe with a 2½" aluminum cap, 22" into the ground, with a 36" stone mound. Cap is marked as shown in the corner diagram. The original stone was buried 1' North of the monument.

From the corner point: (New BT's)

- A 7" dia. Lodgepole Pine bears N. 59° W. at 12.0 ft. dist., mkd. T5S R37E S 16 BT.
- A 8" dia. Lodgepole Pine bears S. 31° E. at 21.3 ft. dist., mkd. T5S R37E S 22 BT.
- A 14" dia. Tamarack bears S. 52° W. at 31.6 ft. dist., mkd. T5S R37E S 21 BT.
- A 8" dia. Tamarack bears N. 61° E. at 97.1 ft. dist., mkd. T5S R37E S 15 BT.

Set a steel fence post 4' East from the monument and attached a USFS 54-9 sign. Painted the face of the blaze and a 6" band around the bearing trees red. Attached I.D. washer and USFS 54-9 and 54-3 signs to the bearing trees. Used 18½° declination on a staff compass for readings to the bearing trees. Used a steel tape to measure to a nail set in the side of the trees. The ¾" dia. brass I.D. washer mkd. PLS 1206 was nailed between the B and T scribes.

This corner was monumented to USFS specifications on August 12, 1987, witnessed by Larry McBroom and Tim Rouse.
