

## T. 5 S., R. 37 E., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

CHAINS

The following field notes describe the remonumentation of certain original corner points, township 5 south, range 37 east, Willamette Meridian, Oregon, as provided for in the Special Instructions, Group Number 1000, Oregon, dated July 13, 1979, "Investigation of Physical Evidence of Corner Positions and Accessories, Followed by Remonumentation of Corner Points, with New Accessories when Needed."

The remonumentation of original corner points was made at the request of the United States Forest Service, in conjunction with their Land Line Location Program.

The mean magnetic declination is 20° E.

## Subdivisions, T. 5 S., R. 37 E., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

(Remonumenting corners established by William B. Graden,  
U. S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1882)

The 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 13 and 14, remonumented with the original basalt stones, 18 x 6 x 6 ins., loosely set & ins. in the ground, mid. 1/4 on N. face, from which the remains of the original bearing tree:

A fir, 19 ins. diam., bears N. 20° E., 19 lbs. dist., with healed blazes.

A fir song, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 25° W., 30 lbs. dist., with scribe mark & visible on partially opened blaze.

At the corner point

Set on aluminum post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, in a collar of stones, with aluminum cap mid.

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 15° W., 46 lbs. dist., mid. 1/4 SSW.

Deposit corner stones and set a steel corner post alongside aluminum post.
