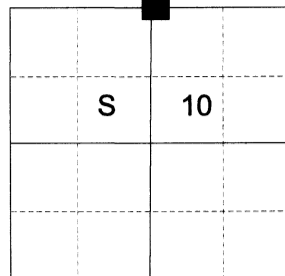


CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHED:

Corner originally established by W. B. Barr under GLO contract number 388 dated May 7, 1881. Surveyor General field notes state:
 Marked volcanic rock 12x10x10 for 1/4 sec. corner, from which:
 A Pine 36 in. diam bears N55°W 42 lks dist
 A Pine 40 in. diam bears S70°E 67 lks dist

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found a 12x10x10 volcanic stone, set 4" in the ground, with chiseled 1/4 in North face.
 No remains found of the original bearing trees.

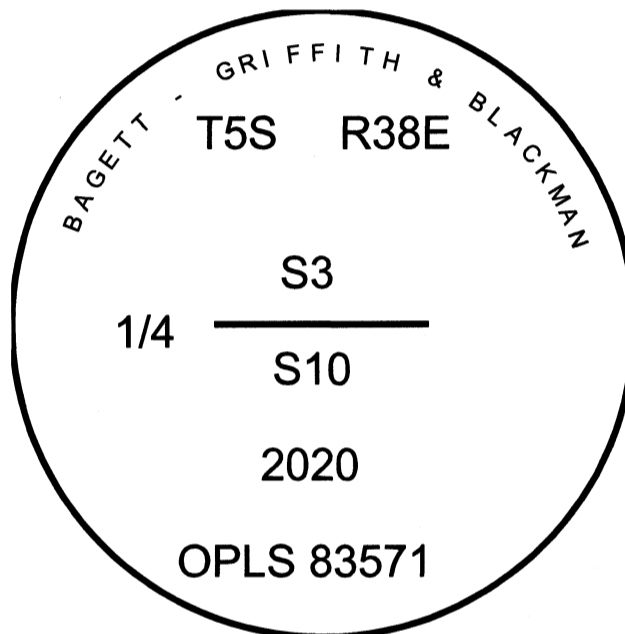
DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO MONUMENT THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At the position of the found stone I set a 2 1/2" x 30" aluminum pipe, 26" in the ground, with 3" aluminum cap marked as shown below and in a 2' diam. mound of stone,
 From which:

NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

- A 7" Douglas Fir bears North 50° East a dist. of 45.60 ft., marked 1/4 S3 BT.
- An 8" Douglas Fir bears South 78° East a dist. of 57.20 ft., marked 1/4 S10 BT.
- A 14" Douglas Fir bears South 39° West a dist. of 33.65 ft., marked 1/4 S10 BT.
- A 7" Ponderosa Pine bears North 38° West a dist. of 56.50 ft., marked 1/4 S3 BT.

A steel fence post is approx. 1' East of the aluminum cap.
 I hereby certify that the corner was perpetuated on September 2, 2020.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new accessories. I used 14° East declination, the distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the bearing trees. A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing trees.
