HISTORY OF ORIGINAL CORNER ESTABLISHED:

Corner originally established by W. B. Barr under GLO contract number 388 dated May 7, 1881. Surveyor General field notes state:

Marked basalt rock 14x10x4 for corner to sec. 11, 12, 13, 14, from which:

A Pine 4 in. diam bears N47°E 32 lks dist

A Pine 3 in. diam bears N47°W 19 lks dist

A Pine 24 in. diam bears S48°E 60 lks dist A Tamarack 12 in. diam bears S51°W 86 lks dist

Corner perpetuated by Scott R. McIntyre under special instructions Group number 1000 for the remonumentation of certain original corners in Township 5 South, Range 38 East dated July 13, 1979. Record states: The cor. of secs. 11, 12, 13, and 14, determined from the remains of the original bearing trees.

A root hole, bears N. 38° E., 32 lks. dist. with a down pine alongside, 10 ins. diam., with illegible scribe marks visible on opened and decayed blaze.

A decayed pine stump, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 48° E., 60 lks. dist., with scribe marks 8 BT visible on weathered and open blaze.

A decayed larch stump, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 51° W., 86 lks. dist., no marks visible.

At the corner point set an aluminum post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with aluminum cap mkd.

DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

Found a 2 1/2" aluminum pipe with 3" aluminum "Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management" cap marked as shown below, 4" above ground, from which:

A heavily decayed log bears North 64° East a dist. of 11 ft., dead and down with partial

scribes visible on a wood remnant.
A stumphole bears South 22° East a dist. of 21 ft.
A 9" Fir bears South 25° West a dist. of 14 ft., dead and down with scribes visible on partially healed blaze.

A 10" stump bears North 44° West, a dist. of 17.80 ft., with BT scribe visible on partially healed blaze.

From the aluminum pipe monument:

NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

An 8" Ponderosa Pine bears North 14° East a dist. of 19.90 ft., marked T5S R38E S12 BT.

An 11" Ponderosa Pine bears South 88° East a dist. of 18.00

ft., marked T5S R38E S13 BT. A 6" Ponderosa Pine bears South 18° West a dist. of 29.15 ft., marked T5S R38E S14 BT.

A 24" Western Larch bears North 46° West a dist. of 33.85 ft., marked T5S R38E S11 BT.

A steel fence post is approx. 0.2 South of the aluminum cap.

I hereby certify that the corner was perpetuated on August 28, 2020.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of the new accessories. I used 14° East declination, the distances are to a 60d spike driven into the right side of the root crown of the bearing trees. A brass washer marked OPLS 83571 is attached to the BT blaze of the new bearing trees.


