Alerch, 17 ins. dism., bears H. 64° E. 17 lks. diss. mkd. T58 R36E 812 BT.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears 5. 22° E., 32 lks. dist., mkd. T58 B188 813 BT.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears \$ 25° W., 214 1ks. dist., mkd. T58 R36E 814 BT.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears H. 44° W., 27 lks. dist., md. T58 R38E 811 BT.

Set a steel feace post alongside aluminum post.

The k sec. cor. of secs. 14 and 23, monumented with the original basalt stone, 12 x 12 x 5 ins., firmly set 8 ins. in the ground, no marks visible, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

- A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 62° E., 23 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on opened blaze.
- A decayed fir stump, 12 ins. diam., bars S. 65° E., 30 lks. dist., with weathered blase, no marks visible.

Set an aluminum post, 28 ins. long, 24 ins. diam., 21 ins. in the ground, in a collar of stone, with aluminum cap mkd.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 60° E., 15 lks. dist., mkd. k \$23 BT.

Deposit corner stone and set a steel fence post alongside aluminum post.

The k sec. cor. of secs. 10 and 11, monumented with the original baselt stone, 16 x 14 x 6 ins., supported by a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, from which the original bearing trees:

A fir, 29 ins. diam., bears S. 559 E., 36 lks.
dlbt., with scribe marks to visible on partially opened blase.
