Description of corner evidence found:

Found both bearing trees alive and well. For the Northwest bearing tree found a Pine 18 ins. dia., blaze opened and scribing visible "1/4 S". BT blaze closed.

For the Southeast bearing tree found a Pine 16 ins. dia., both blazes healed.

At the position for the stone no evidence of original stone remained.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At the position determined by reference to the original BT's, we set a 2"x30" aluminum pipe 24" in the ground with aluminum cap attached, T5S R38E marked:

With raised mound of stone from which the original bearing trees are:

An 18" Ponderosa Pine with upper blaze open and scribing visible bears N 65°W, 113 feet dist.

A 16" Ponderosa Pine bears S 43°E, 47 feet dist.

Both blazes closed.
