Description of corner evidence found:

Found the original corner monument, a basalt stone, 14"x11"x6", loosely set, 5" in the ground, with chisel markings "1/4" on west face, from which:

A badly decayed Ponderosa Pine stump, approx. 30" dia. when cut, no markings found,

bears N 63°W 26.4 feet to the approx. original face.
The position for the original NE bearing tree falls along a logging skid trail. We find fragments of roots and wood in the ground at its approx. location.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At the position of the found stone, we set a 2"x30" galvanized iron pipe, 24" in the ground, with brass cap attached, marked:

T5S R38E

1/4 S27 S26

The original stone is buried along the east side of the brasscapped pipe.
