History of original corner establishment:

Original corner set by William B. Barr, under GLO Contract No. 388, approved December 31, 1881.

Record States: Marked basalt rock 10x8x8 for corner to secs. 29, 30, 31, 32, from which:

Fir, 5 in. dia., bears S 32 1/2° E, 17 lks dist.

Fir, 10 in. dia., bears N 59° E, 18 lks dist.

Tamarack, 15 in. dia., bears N 65° W, 17 lks dist.

Tamarack, 10 in. dia., bears S 8° W, 23 lks dist.

Subsequent Monumentation

Corner was remonumented by Scott R. McIntyre, under BLM Group No. 1000, approved December 27, 1983.

Record States: The cor of secs. 29, 30, 31, and 32, monumented with the original basalt stone, 10x8x8 ins., firmly set 5 ins. in the ground, no marks visible, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A fir stump, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 54° E., 18 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, size

indeterminate, with scribe marks T5S 29 visible on open blaze. (Record, N. 59 $^{\circ}$ E.) A root hole, bears S. 32 ½ $^{\circ}$ E., 17 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, 5 ins. diam., with scribe marks S32 BT visible on open blaze.


A root hole, bears S. 8° W., 23 lks. dist., with a down larch alongside, 10 ins. diam., with scribe marks S31 BT visible on open blaze.

A root hole, bears N. 65° W., 17 lks. dist., with a down larch alongside, 15 ins. diam., with scribe marks S30 BT visible on open blaze.

At the corner point: Set an aluminum post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 23 ins. in the ground, in a collar of stone, with aluminum cap mkd. (as shown below) from which new bearing trees:

A lodgepole pine, 5 ins. diam., bears N. 19° E., 34 lks. dist., mkd. T5S R38E S29 BT. A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 68° E., 19 lks. dist., mkd T5S R38E S32 BT. A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 36° W., 21 lks. dist., mkd. T5S R38E S31 BT.

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears N. 73° W., 30 lks. dist., mkd. T5S R38E S30 BT.



Description of corner evidence found:

Found 2½ ins. diam. alum. pipe, projecting 4 ins. above ground, with rock collar, and a standard BLM 31/4 ins. diam. alum. cap, marked as shown:

From the recovered monument I find the original bearing tree remains:

Down tree remains, bears S. 32° E., 17 lks dist., with scribe marks visible.

A root hole, bears S. 8° W., 15.2 ft. dist., with dead and down tree alongside and visible scribe marks. And accessories mkd. by McIntyre:

A root hole, bears N. 19° E., 22.4 ft dist., with dead and down 5 in. diam. snag alongside and full scribe visible on open blaze.

A white fir, 27 ins. diam., bears S. 68° E., 12.5 ft. dist., alive and healthy, with healed blaze. A fir stump, bears S. 36° W., 13.9 ft. dist., with full scribe visible on open blaze. A white fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 73° W., 19.8 ft. dist., alive and healthy, with healed blaze.

Found guard post ±1.5 ft.W'ly with Land Survey Monument (54-9) sign attached.



Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate original location of this corner:

New bearing trees:

A white fir, 4 ins. diam., bears S. 24° W., 41.2 ft. dist., mkd. X BT on double blaze. A lodgepole pine, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 12° W., 28.4 ft. dist., mkd. X BT on double blaze. No suitable NE bearing trees.

All new bearing trees are marked on a single blaze unless noted otherwise and have a nail with a brass washer stamped "LS 2648" right side center for distance measurements

Painted 6 ins. red bands and added Bearing Tree (54-3) and Land Survey Monument (54-9) signs as needed to all bearing trees.

Long. 118°05'46.2" W
